PCS Activities Categories

Planning CPD (Professional Development Plan) – Now Mandatory

- Backed by research and designed to promote ongoing professional development.
- Ensures alignment with PCS requirements
- Encourages reflective and structured learning
- Helps you plan the time and financial resources needed to undertake relevant learning activities.
- It is not a tool for use by employers, Training Bodies, or the Medical Council to assess performance.

How to gather 5 CPD credits for Planning activity

- Submitting your plan to your e-Portfolio attracts 3 CPD Credits. (It is highly recommended to complete the planning section by 30th June 2025 to claim 3 credits, and to complete the remaining sections before the end of the PCS year on 30th April 2026).
- Recording your peer review in your e-Portfolio attracts 1 CPD Credit. You have the option to invite a colleague to complete this in the Planning PDP form in your e-portfolio.
- Recording some notes about reviewing and reflecting on your plan at year-end attracts **1 CPD Credit.**

Practice Review Activity (Audit, quality improvement and/or practice evaluation):

- Clinical audits (e.g. documentation of regional blocks)
- Review of critical incidents /significant events
- Review of patient compliments and complaints.
- Structured feedback from colleagues, patients, or students; patient satisfaction survey.
- 360° feedback analysis
